Result This study identifies the themes of psychological responses during test among people living with HIV the themes are afraid of positive result, wish for negative result, readiness, and shock It expected to healthcare services and ARV also government assure the longlife people living with HIV. The findings recommend healthcare providers further optimized and government monitoring evaluation of HIV program, in order to give real impact in the prevention of HIV pandemic.
